In the spirit of the holiday, please silence your cell phones and other electronic devices while in the sanctuary.

Aside from Shabbat, **Yom Kippur** is the single most important observance on the Jewish calendar. The main ritual of Yom Kippur is the fast, lasting from sundown the evening before Yom Kippur and concluding at sundown on Yom Kippur itself. The fast is symbolic of a spiritual "reset." Just like you might restart your computer, this is the time when we reset and re-center ourselves to prepare for a new year. We spend the day in prayer and contemplation, seeking forgiveness for our sins and pledging to improve ourselves and the world in the coming year.
